

# Privacy Policy

This privacy policy applies between you, the user of this website and The Family Trust, the owner and provider of this website. The Family Trust takes the privacy of your information very seriously. This privacy policy applies to our use of any and all data collected by us or provided by you through your use of this Website.

## **Definitions and Interpretation**

1. In this privacy policy, the following definitions are used:

#### **Data**

collectively all information that you submit to The Family Trust via the website. This definition incorporates; the definitions provided in the Data Protection Laws.

#### **Cookies**

a small text file placed on your computer by this website when you visit certain parts of the Website and /or when you use certain features of the Website. Details of the cookies used by this Website are set out in the clause below (Cookies).

#### **Data Protection Laws**

any applicable law relating to the processing of personal data, including but not limited to the Directive 96/46/EC (Data Protection Directive) or the GDPR, and any national implementing laws, regulations and secondary legislation, for as long as the GDPR is effective in the UK.

#### **GDPR**

the General Data Protection Regulation (EU) 2016/679.

#### The Family Trust, we or us

The Family Trust, a company incorporated in England and Wales with registered number 09453991 whose registered office is at 4 Buckland Road, Maidstone, Kent, ME16 0SL.

#### **UK and EU Cookie Law**

#### User or vou

any third party that accesses the Website and is not either (i) employed by The Family Trust and acting in the course of their employment or (ii) engaged as a consultant or otherwise providing services to The Family Trust and accessing the Website in connection with the provision of such services.

# Scope of this Privacy Policy

- 2. This privacy policy applies only to the actions of The Family Trust and Users with respect to this Website and the chequer tree website. It does not extend to any other sites that can be accessed from these websites including, but not limited to, any links we may provide to social media websites.
- 3. For purposes of the applicable Data Protection Laws, The Family Trust is the "data controller". This means that The Family Trust determines the purposes for which, and the manner in which, your data is processed.

### **Data Collected**

- 4. We may collect the following data, which includes personal Data, from you:
  - a. name
  - b. date of birth
  - c. gender
  - d. job title
  - e. profession
  - f. contact Information such as email addresses and telephone numbers
  - g. demographic information such as postcode, preferences and interests; in each case, in accordance with this privacy policy.

#### How we collect data

- 5. We collect Data in the following ways:
  - a. data is given to us by you;
  - b. data is received from other sources; and
  - c. data is collected automatically.

#### Data that is given to us by you

- 6. The Family Trust will collect your data in a number of ways, for example, (but not limited to):
  - a. when you contact us through the website, by telephone, post, e-mail
  - b. when you register with us and receive our services
  - c. when you complete surveys that we use for research purposes (although you are not obliged to respond to them).
  - d. when you enter a competition or promotion through a social media channel
  - e. when you make payments to us, through this website or other
  - f. when you elect to receive marketing communications from us

#### **Data that is received from third parties**

- 7. The Family Trust will receive data about you from the following third parties:
  - a. Social Media
  - b. Beacon CRM

#### Data that is received from publicly available third parties sources

- 8. We will receive Data about you from the following publicly available third party sources:
  - a. Facebook
  - b. Twitter
  - c. Instagram

#### Data that is collected automatically

- 9. To the extent that you access the website, we will collect your data automatically, for example:
  - a. we automatically collect some information about your visit to the Website. This information helps us to make improvements to website content and navigation, and includes your IP address, the date, times and frequency with which you access the website and the way you use and interact with its content.
  - b. we will collect your Data automatically via cookies, in line with the cookie settings on your browser. For more information about cookies, and how we use them on the website, see the section below, headed "Cookies".

#### Our use of Data

- 10. Any or all of the above data may be required by us from time to time in order to provide you with the best possible service and experience when using our website. Specifically, data may be used by us for the following reasons:
  - a. internal record keeping
  - b. improvement of our services
  - c. transmission by email of marketing materials that may be of interest to you
  - d. contact for market research purposes which may be done using email, telephone, or mail. Such information may be used to customise or update the website in each case, in accordance with this privacy policy.
- 11. We may use your Data for the above purposes if we deem it necessary to do so for our legitimate interests. If you are not satisfied with this, you have the right to object in certain circumstances (see the section headed "Your rights" below).
- 12. For the delivery of direct marketing to you via e-mail, we'll need your consent, whether via an opt-in or soft-opt-in.
  - a. soft opt-in consent is a specific type of consent which applies when you have previously engaged with us (for example, you contact us to ask us for more details about a particular service, and we are marketing similar services). Under "soft opt-in" consent, we will take your consent as given unless you opt-out.
  - b. for other types of e-marketing, we are required to obtain your explicit consent; that is, you need to take positive and affirmative action when consenting by, for example, checking a tick box that we'll provide.
  - c. if you are not satisfied about our approach to marketing, you have the right to withdraw consent at any time. To find out how to withdraw your consent, see the section headed "Your rights" below.
- 13. When you register with us and our services, the legal basis for this processing is the performance of a contract between you and us and/or taking steps, at your request, to enter into such a contract.

#### Who we share data with

14. We may share your Data with the following groups of people for the following reasons: a. our employees, agents and/or professional advisors - To help develop our communication and to find out what organisations are engaging with our charity and the services we provide in each case, in accordance with this privacy policy.

#### **Keeping data secure**

15. We will use technical and organisational measures to safeguard your Data, for example:

- a. access to your account is controlled by a password and a username that is unique to you.
- b. we store your Data on secure servers.
- 16. Technical and organisational measures include measures to deal with any suspected data breach. - 17. #### **Data retention**

- 18. Unless a longer retention period is required or permitted by law, we will only hold your Data on our systems for the period necessary to fulfil the purposes outlined in this privacy policy or until you request that the data be deleted.
- 19. Even if we delete your data, it may persist on backup or archival media for legal, tax or regulatory purposes.

#### **Your rights**

- 20. You have the following rights in relation to your data:
  - a. Right to access the right to request (i) copies of the information we hold about you at any time, or (ii) that we modify, update or delete such information. If we provide you with access to the information we hold about you, we will not charge you for this, unless your request is "unfounded or excessive." Where we are legally permitted to do so, we may refuse your request. If we refuse your request, we will tell you the reasons why.
  - b. Right to correct the right to have your data rectified if it is inaccurate or incomplete.
  - c. Right to erase the right to request that we delete or remove your data from our systems.
  - d. Right to restrict our use of your data the right to "block" us from using your data or limit the way in which we can use it.
  - e. Right to data portability the right to request that we move, copy or transfer your data.
  - f. Right to object the right to object to our use of your data including where we use it for our legitimate interests.

- 38. This Agreement will be governed by and interpreted according to the law of England and Wales. All disputes arising under the Agreement will be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the English and Welsh courts.
