Challenge

5 minutes

Recycling is a good way of making sure we are looking after the environment. Before putting any rubbish in the bin, have a look to see if that item could be recycled. For example, paper, card and tins can be put in the recycling bin as they can be used again.



Discuss

5 minutes

- Do you have a favourite place to visit for a walk? Where is it?
- What is your favourite game to play in the park?
- How can we look after the environment in school and at home?

2 minutes

It's time to notice the people around you and think of ways you can help others. What can you do to help other children and adults feel happy? Maybe you can sit with someone new at lunch time, or talk to someone who may be on their own, or simply ask how someone's day is going.


